The votes recorded here are only a few of the many hundreds of votes the members of the General Court cast in 2007. Keeping this in mind, we tried to select the most clear-cut, pro-family and anti-family votes of this session. The current General Court continued to attack the natural family at every turn. Over and over they said you were not important. Even though there were several bills introduced to reinforce your role as a parent, this body of legislators voted against your constitutional right to parent your children. In fact, this legislature moved to have government assume more and more of your parental responsibility.

CPR Action is committed to assisting you to strengthen and defend your family, your faith and your freedoms in New Hampshire. We will continue to watch the legislative activities in Concord. But, we need your help. Reporting on the votes is only the beginning of the legislative process. We are dependent upon you to be informed and active constituents who work with us by fighting for your values. That means being registered to vote and going to the polls for special elections and the general election. It is also important that you communicate with your legislative member(s) about the bills before them.

Many family friendly legislators were unseated in the 2006 elections because Value Voters stayed home and did not vote. # 2008 Review of New Hampshire Senate Bills & Votes

1. CACR34 This constitutional amendment concurrent resolution requires the general court to define an adequate education and to **distribute state funds for public education** in a manner that alleviates local disparities. Committee recommended Ought to Pass. Floor amendment would require full funding by the state of any mandate.

Sponsored by Senator Joseph Foster, District 13

Floor amendment failed (Yeas 10 / Nays 14)  
February 21, 2008

Status – Failed in the House

CPR Action supported the floor amendment.

2. CACR34 This constitutional amendment concurrent resolution requires the general court to define an adequate education and to **distribute state funds for public education** in a manner that alleviates local disparities. Committee recommended Ought to Pass.

Sponsored by Senator Joseph Foster, District 13

Passed (Yeas 19 / Nays 5) February 21, 2008

Status – Failed in the House

CPR Action supported the CACR allowing the people to vote.

3. SB 337 Requires **home educators additional reporting** regarding curriculum. Committee recommended Ought to Pass as amended. Amendment adds legislative members to the home education advisory council, and **establishes a commission to examine New Hampshire's home education statutes.**

Sponsored by Senator Iris Estabrook, District 21

Passed (Yeas 14 / Nays 10) March 13, 2008

CPR Action opposed this bill.

4. SB 353 Provides that the State of New Hampshire and its political subdivisions shall not serve as a sanctuary for illegal aliens and **requires state and local law enforcement agencies to enforce immigration laws** to the extent authorized by federal law. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.

Sponsored by Senator Joseph Kenney, District 3

Passed (Yeas 13 / Nays 10) March 6, 2008

CPR Action supported this bill.

5. SB 436 This bill **enables 17-year-olds to vote** in primaries if they will be 18 years of age on the date of the general election. Committee recommended Ought to Pass.

Sponsored by Senator Joseph Foster, District 13

Passed (Yeas 17 / Nays 6) February 7, 2008

Status – House Laid on the Table

CPR Action opposed this bill.

6. SB 493 Includes certain tax exempt organizations in the definition of **charitable organizations for games of chance** operations. Committee recommended Ought to Pass.

Sponsored by Senator Jacalyn Cilley, District 6

Passed (Yeas 19 / Nays 5) March 13, 2008

Status – Failed in the House

CPR Action opposed this bill.

7. SB 527 Titled an act relative to **adult involvement for minors seeking an abortion**, requires a counselor or health care provider to provide a pregnant minor, under the age of 17 years, with counseling and information before such minor has an abortion. Committee recommended Ought to Pass amended. Floor amendment restores the parental notification law and adds a medical emergency exception to such law. The bill also affords the pregnant minor 24-hour access to a judge for waiver of notification.

Sponsored by Senator Kathleen Sgambati, District 4

Floor amendment offered by Senator Jack Barnes, District 17

Amendment failed (Yeas 9 / Nays 15) March 20, 2008

CPR Action supported the floor amendment.

8. SB 527 Titled an act relative to **adult involvement for minors seeking an abortion**, requires a counselor or health care provider to provide a pregnant minor, under the age of 17 years, with counseling and information before such minor has an abortion. Committee recommended Ought to Pass as amended.

Sponsored by Senator Kathleen Sgambati, District 4

Failed (Yeas 10 / Nays 14) March 20, 2008

CPR Action opposed this bill.

# 2008 Review of New Hampshire House Bills

1. CACR 21 A constitutional amendment concurrent resolution to provide that the **local subdivision responsible for public education** shall have the power to determine curriculum, set standards, and determine funding, and that the legislature may provide supplemental funding. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Paul Ingbretson, Grafton District 5  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 215 / Nays 91)  
March 5, 2008  
Status – CACR failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this CACR.
2. CACR 23 A constitutional amendment concurrent resolution to secure the **right of parents** to control the welfare and education of their children. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Dan Itse, Rockingham District 9  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 222 / Nays 103)  
March 5, 2008  
Status – CACR failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this CACR.
3. CACR 29 This constitutional amendment concurrent resolution **reestablishes the recognition of local control of education** in the New Hampshire constitution. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Dan Itse, Rockingham District 9  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 214 / Nays 94)  
March 5, 2008  
Status – CACR failed in the House  
CPR Action opposed this bill.
4. CACR 34 This constitutional amendment concurrent resolution requires the general court to **define an adequate education and distribute state funds for public education** in a manner that alleviates local disparities. Committee recommended Ought to Pass.  
Sponsored by Senator Joseph Foster, District 13  
Committee recommendation failed (Yeas 97 / Nays 238)  
May 14, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action opposed this bill.
5. HB 1185 Restricts government action from burdening a person's **free exercise of religion**. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Dan Itse, Rockingham District 9  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 223 / Nays 91)  
March 12, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
6. HB 1160 Establishes the **women's health protection act**. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Dan Itse, Rockingham District 9  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 236 / Nays 79)  
March 13, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
7. HB 1495 Restores the **parental notification law** and adds a medical emergency exception to such law. The bill also affords the pregnant minor 24-hour access to a judge for waiver of notification. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Fran Wendelboe, Belknap District 1  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 190 / Nays 128)  
March 13, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
8. HB 1498 Requires **notification of a parent or guardian by medical professionals** when treating a minor. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Maureen Mooney, Hillsborough District 19  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 270 / Nays 111)  
March 13, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
9. HB 1517 Requires the **consent of the parents before** any physician performs an abortion on an unemancipated minor less than 18 years of age. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Nancy Elliott, Hillsborough 19  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 211 / Nays 109)  
March 13, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
10. HB 1588 Requires any person performing an abortion on an unemancipated minor to verify the **minor's state of residency and to abide by that state's laws regarding parental consent and notification**. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Nancy Elliott, Hillsborough 19  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 210 / Nays 106)  
March 13, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
11. HB 1589 Prohibits the **lethal injection** of any substance as part of the **abortion process**. Committee recommended Inexpedient to Legislate.  
Sponsored by Representative Nancy Elliott, Hillsborough 19  
Committee recommendation passed (Yeas 208 / Nays 109)  
March 18, 2008  
Status – Failed in the House  
CPR Action supported this bill.
12. SB 337 Amends the notification **requirements for** commencing or continuing a **home education program**, adds legislative members to the home education advisory council, and establishes a commission to examine New Hampshire's home education statutes. Committee recommended Ought to Pass as amended.  
Sponsored by Senator Iris Estabrook, District 21  
Passed (Yeas 188 / Nays 168) May 14, 2008  
Status – Senate concurred, moved to the desk of Governor Lynch  
CPR Action opposed this bill.
